Morris of the second part, Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of \$500 (five hundred and fifty Dollars) the said W. B. Bradshaw and Martha Ann Bradshaw, his wife, do grant unto the said William K. Morris and his heirs forever with general warranty, all of a certain tract or parcel of land known as the March second tract (formerly belonging to Samuel Spivey) containing 1000 one hundred and thirteen and half acres, be the same more or less and bounded by the lands of John Spivey, James B.
