This Deed made this 11<sup>th</sup> & day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred & eighty one between Rich. Brister of the first part and P. Vick of the second part, Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of \$1800<sup>00</sup> and hundred and fifty Dollars, the said Rich. Brister does grant unto the said P. Vick and his heirs forever with good and lawful title, all of a certain Lot or parcel of land (a part of the Mt. Hope tract) lying and being situated in the village of Berlin containing (6) six acres, more or less, and bounded by the Green Land on the South & West, and by the Brown Road to the Generalm. Store Road on the North & East, said lot commencing at the junction of the said two roads, The said Rich. Brister covenants that he has the right to convey the said land to the grantee; that he has done no act to encumber the said land, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, free from all encumbrances, and that he said Rich. Brister party of the first part, will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be requisite, Witness the following signatures and seal.

This Deed made this 31<sup>st</sup> day of January A D 1831, between &c within Williams and Nancy Pittman, Executors of the first part and John W. Pittman & Granters of the other, past all of Southampton County Virginia, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which the parties of the first part, bear to the party of the other part, who is the nephew of the said Martha Williams, and the son of the said Nancy Pittman, they the said Martha Williams and Nancy Pittman do grant and convey, give and confirm unto the said John W. Pittman, the following, property to wit, all of the interest which the said Martha Williams came in the tract of Land formerly belonging to Richard Williams dead, containing 300 acres, more or less, and which by consent of the parties interested therein to wit, the said Nancy Pittman and the said Martha Williams, is that part of said tract lying on the Wakefield Road, and running parallel therewith from the line of Wm. S. to the line of Harris Turner, and following the line of said parties, in a right course to a point sufficiently indicated to include the sum of 100 acres, which is to lie as before mentioned in a solid body on said Wakefield Road, but if the line should take in the buildings comprising the old settlement of Rich<sup>d</sup> Williams dead, then it must vary so as to leave
