This Deed made this 11th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred & eighty one between Rich. Bristow of the first part and P. Vick of the second parts, Whereas, that in consideration of the sum of \$1500⁰⁰ and hundred and fifty Dollars, the said Rich. Bristow does grant unto the said P. Vick and his heirs forever with good and lawful heirs in the village of Berlin containing (6) six acres, more or less, and bounded by the Crown Lands on the South & West, and by the Rowson Road to the Jurisdiction of the Rowson on the North & East, said lot commencing at the junction of the said two roads, the said Rich. Bristow covenants that he has the right to convey the said land to the grantee; that he has done no act to encumber the said land, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, free from all encumbrances, and that he said Rich. Bristow party of the first part, will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be requisite, Witness the following signatures and seal.

This Deed made this 31st day of January A. D. 1881, between Martha Williams and Nancy Pittman, Executors of the first part and John W. Pittman Grants of the other part all of Southampton County Virginia, Whereas, that for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which the parties of the first part, bear to the party of the other part, who is the nephew of the said Martha Williams, and the son of the said Nancy Pittman, they the said Martha Williams and Nancy Pittman do grant and convey, give and confirm unto the said John W. Pittman, the following property to wit: all of the interest which the said Martha Williams owns in the tract of land formerly belonging to Richard Williams dead, containing 303 acres, more or less, and which by consent of the parties interested therein, to wit the said Nancy Pittman and the said Martha Williams is that part of said tract lying on the Wakefield Road, and running parallel therewith from the line of W. R. L. Cobb to the line of Harrie Turner, and following the line of said parcels, in a West course to a point sufficiently indicated to include the sum of 100 acres, which is to lie as before mentioned in a West body on said Wakefield Road, but if the line should take in the buildings comprising the old settlement of Rich^d Williams dead, then it must survey as to least
