This Deed made the 10th day of September in the year 1850 between W. W. Moore of the one part and Jas. H. Deany, of the other part, witnesses that the said W. W. Moore doth grant unto the said Jas. H. Deany, the following property, to wit: One Steam Engine, Boilers, Saw Mill and all the fixtures connected therewith, One grist mill and fixtures, working by steam, all now in my possession, all interest I W. W. Moore have or may hereafter have in the lot and property of my Aunt Mrs. Sarah Council, situated in the town of Franklin Southampton County Va. in trust to secure the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) with interest thereon from 1st April 1850 until paid, due to W. Nicholson, as evidenced by note bearing date and amount above named, the conditions of this agreement and deed are, that partial payments shall be made as fast as money shall be received from the use of the mills, or from any other source, and that a perfectly fair and reasonable term shall be given for the full payment of the whole, of which the trustee shall be the Judge, that the property shall be carefully protected from drainage or damage from fire, or any other source of destruction, and kept in proper working order and repair.
