

This deed of trust made this 14th day of March 1881 between James N. Leeson and Edith L. his wife, parties of the first part, and W. E. Moyleick, trustee of second part, witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of five dollars, in hand paid, the said parties of the first part, do grant and convey with general warranty unto the said W. E. Moyleick, trustee, the following real estate, to wit a certain tract of land situated in Southampton County, State of Virginia containing two hundred acres more or less, bounded as follows: west of a line to commence at a post in the center of the old path or road which runs the cider house or barn that runs from R. T. Bryant's house towards Mrs P. A. Meaffter's house, thence also a direct south course a line of posts and marked trees to Mrs P. A. Meaffter's line, thence down said Meaffter line to Richard A. Barrett's line, thence down said Barrett line to the branch commonly called the Carter branch, thence down the various courses of said Carter branch to the path or road that leads from Arthur Whitley's shop to R. T. Bryant's house, thence down said path or road or way in west course to the commencement, and one half of his house also purchased vicinity of the said Richard L. Bryant. In trustee secure the payment of a bond for one hundred and fifty Two Dollars due by James N. Leeson to W. E. Moyleick the bond of even date with this deed and an demand. And it is agreed by parties hereto that whenever the said W. E. Moyleick, shall desire by notifying the trustee verbally or in writing, this deed shall be in force, after twenty days notice of time and place, and upon such terms as the said W. E. Moyleick may desire, and in the event of a sale by virtue of this deed, the trustee shall be entitled to a commission of five per cent on gross amount of sales.
