This Agreement entered into this 12th day of March 1881 between Geo W Rumer and J E P Rumer merchants and partners trading under the firm name of Rumer & Bros of one part and J W Blount of the other part. Witness that whereas the said J W Blount is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain during the year 1881 advances in money or supplies from the said Rumer & Bros to the amount of Four Hundred Dollars Cotton weighing 450 lbs valued at one hundred & sixty dollars beyond which limit the said J W Blount shall not go; and the said Rumer & Bros having agreed on their part to furnish the said advances. Now the said J W Blount on his part in consideration of the above premises do hereby grant a lien to the said Rumer & Bros on the crops which may be made during the year 1881 upon the land in the cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been or shall be extended to him as herein expressed. This lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 1853, entitled an Act to secure a claim for agricultural purposes. Witness the foregoing signatures and seals.
