This Agreement made this 30th day of March in the year 1881 between J. P. Blaud of the
 first part and Jack & Runner of the latter part, both of the County of Southampton State
 of Virginia. Witnesseth as follows, Whereas, the said Jack & Runner is engaged in, or
 is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said J. P. Blaud
 shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivation of the soil,
 which the said J. P. Blaud has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, that
 the said J. P. Blaud does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said
 Jack & Runner, during the present year, such monies, provisions, fertilizers and
 other supplies (not exceeding the sum of Eighty dollars in amount) as may be
 needed to enable the said Jack & Runner to cultivate and gather his crops provided to
 be made the present year. And the said Jack & Runner hereby gives and guarantees to
 the said J. P. Blaud a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit
 Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Beans, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment
 for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum
 above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General
