Whereas the Legislature of Virginia has by law authorized all persons who are Homeholders and heads of families by their act with certain property to be held as a Homestead for the benefit to be held as a Homestead for the benefit of himself wife and Children. Now therefore Casimer Giraud of Southampton County and State of Virginia do hereby by due and full power and the following property, trust All my Household and Kitchen furniture valued at \$100.00. This Bed, a small cat bed, one Sewing machine valued at \$2.50, Farming implements valued at \$2.00, one mule valued at \$50.00, a team of two Cows and Calves valued at \$100.00 Two Sheep and Pigs, valued at \$3.00. Sixteen barrels of long corn valued at \$1.50 each barrel of feed, valued at \$0.50. Six hundred pounds of bacon, valued at \$1.00. Pounds valued at \$0.50, and forty chickens, valued at \$0.50 total value (\$44.00) all to be held by me as a homestead for the benefit of myself wife Sarah J. Giraud and my three children, namely William G. Giraud and Blanch Giraud. Witness my hand and seal this 5th day of April A.D. 1881.

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This Deed made this 6th day of April 1881 between Nofleet Brown of one part and J J Woodard of the second part, witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the said party of the first part does fully grant and convey with general warranty unto the said J J Woodard and his heirs forever the following parcel of land situated in Southampton County to wit: a certain parcel of land containing 99 acres by survey bounded by the lands of Albert Gaizard & Jessie Claude, Richard Harris, L. R. Price & J J Woodard same being land allotted to Benjamin Brown in right of his wife Louise Brown, in a Chancery suit in the County Court of Southampton in 1840 the suit being styled Nofleet v Nofleet and the said Nofleet Brown being the only living descendant of Louisa Brown.
