This Agreement made this 17th day of March in the year 1871 between Davy Dillard of Southampton County, of the first part, and N. P. Helman of Southampton County, of the second part, of the State of Virginia, Witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said Davy Dillard is engaged in, or about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said N. P. Helman should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which said N. P. Helman has agreed to do. Now this agreement Witnesseth that the said N. P. Helman doth hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Davy Dillard during the present year such monies as provisions of fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of one hundred & sixty dollars in amount) as may be needful to enable the said Davy Dillard to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Davy Dillard hereby gives and grants to the said N. P. Helman a lien upon all crops that he may make on the lands which he has or may have in cultivation in the County of Southampton during the present year, to wit: Corn, Rye, Oats, Potatoes, Woolen and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1873.

This Agreement entered into this 26th day of March 1871 between Wm. Beaton of one part and William R. Johnson of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said William R. Johnson is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain during the year 1871 advances in supplies from the said Wm. Beaton to the amount of one hundred dollars; and the said Wm. Beaton having agreed, on his part to furnish the said amount of advances now the said Wm. R. Johnson on his part in consideration of the above promises doth hereby give and grant to the said Wm. Beaton, an interest in sales of lint cotton weighing five hundred pound each of the first cotton picked from the fields in cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been, or was intended to have been expended. This lien is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure advances for agricultural purposes. Witness the following signatures.
