J. B. Prince upon all his crops of cotton, corn & tobacco to raise during the year
1881. The same to be paid for with 3/4 below cotton to weigh 142 lbs each
grade on settling to be delivered at Beaufort by the 1st of next

This Agreement made this 18th day of April in the year 1881 between J. E. Applewhite
of Southampton County of the first part and R. S. Pope of Southampton County,
of the second part of the State of Virginia. Witnesseth as follows. Whereas the said
J. E. Applewhite is engaged to agree about to engage in the cultivation of the soil
and is desirous that the said child during the present year make certain advance
to the said cultivator of the soil which said R. S. Pope has agreed to do. Now this
agreement witnesseth, That the said R. S. Pope doth hereby promises and agrees
to advance and furnish to the said J. E. Applewhite during the present year such
machinery provisions, fertilizer and other supplies not exceeding the sum of Fifty
dollars ¹⁰⁰ for the same to enable the said J. E. Applewhite to cultivate
and gather his crops prepared to him for the present year. And the said J. E. Apple-
white hereby gives and grants to the said R. S. Pope, a live stock of all crops that he
may make on the land which he has, or may have in cultivation in the County
of Southampton during the present year to wit: Corn, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton
and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and
advances as may be actually made, not excluding the sum above stated.
This Agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly
of Virginia approved April 12, 1873. Witness our hands this 18th day of April 1881
