 in agriculture and diverse occupations & supplies an amount not exceeding two
 hundred dollars and 3 pence Ster. Records & banes and when with said J. B. Prince
 J. B. Prince is willing & agreed to furnish the said Thom Pennipen an
 amount not exceeding two hundred dollars & 3 pence in Ster. Records & banes
 therefore the said Thom Pennipen hereby gives and grants a lien to said J. B. Prince
 J. B. Prince upon all his crops of cotton, corn & potatoes to be raised during the year
 1881. The means to be paid for with 3 pence bales cotton to weigh 40 lbs each to
 grade middling & delivered at Beaufield by 10 o'clock not

This Agreement made this 15th day of April in the year 1881 between J. E. H. Phillips
 of Southampton County, of the first part and R. S. Pope of Southampton County,
 of the second part of the State of Virginia, Witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said
 J. E. H. Phillips is engaged in agriculture and is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil
 and is desirous that the said R. S. Pope should during the present year make certain advances
 to the said cultivator of the soil, which said R. S. Pope has agreed to do. Now this
 agreement witnesseth that the said R. S. Pope doth hereby promise and agree
 to advance and furnish to the said J. E. H. Phillips, during the present year, such
 money, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of \$100
 five hundred dollars as may be necessary to enable the said J. E. H. Phillips to cultivate
 and gather his crops & to be paid to him during the present year. And the said J. E. H. Phillips
 doth hereby give and grant to the said R. S. Pope, a lien upon all crops that he
 may make on the lands which he has, or may have in cultivation in the County
 of Southampton, during the present year, to wit: Cotton, Potatoes, Peas, Pumpkins, corn
 and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and
 advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.
 This Agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly
 of Virginia, approved April 21st 1873. Witness our hands this 15th day of April 1881.
