This Agreement made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April in the year 1881, between J. W. Cornette of Southampton County, of the first part, and Lewis Marks of Southampton County of the second part of the State of Virginia, witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said J. W. Cornette is engaged in an as about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Lewis Marks shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which said Lewis Marks has agreed to do to this Agreement notwithstanding; That the said Lewis Marks doth hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said J. W. Cornette during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of Two hundred and Seventy five dollars in amount as may be needful to enable the said J. W. Cornette to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year; And the said J. W. Cornette hereby gives and grants to the said Lewis Marks a lien upon all crops that he may make on the lands which he has or may have in cultivation in the County of Southampton during the present year to wit, Corn, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873, witness our hands this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1881.

This Agreement made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April in the year 1881, between Ephraim Ford of Southampton County, of the first part, and R. S. Pope of Southampton County, of the second part of the State of Virginia, witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said Ephraim Ford is engaged in an as about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said R. S. Pope shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which said R. S. Pope has agreed to do to this Agreement notwithstanding; That the said R. S. Pope doth hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Ephraim Ford during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of Fourteen  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars in amount as may be needful to enable the said Ephraim Ford to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year; And the said Ephraim Ford hereby gives and grants to the said R. S. Pope a lien upon all crops that he may make on the lands which he has or may have in cultivation in the County of Southampton during the present year to wit, Corn, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated.
