 part, and Jno. Blunt of the other part, Witnesseth, That whereas the said Jno. Blunt
 is engaged in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain advances in
 supplies from the said J. B. James & Co. to the amount of one hundred and fifty
 dollars, beyond which limit the said Jno. Blunt shall not go, and the said J. B.
 James & Co. having agreed, on this part to furnish said amount of advances, Now
 the said Jno. Blunt, on his part in consideration of the above premises does hereby
 grant to him to the said J. B. James & Co. on all the crops made during the year 1891
 and the lands in cultivation of which the said amount of advances may, or may
 intended to have been expended, This claim is granted under an Act of the General
 Assembly of Virginia, approved April the 3rd 1873, entitled an Act to secure

This Deed made this 6th day of May 1891, between Samuel Thro. Griffin of the first
 part, and S. R. Griffin trustee of the second part Both of the County of Southampton
 and State of Virginia Witnesseth, That for and in consideration of the sum of five
 dollars in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said party
 of the first part doth grant and convey unto the said party of the second part, all
 of his right title and interest in and to that certain tract of land lying in the County
 of Sussex and known as the Redman's old tract and bounded by the lands of
 his sons namely, Ely Bryant and others, containing thirty four acres more or less
 and also all of his right title and interest in and to the lands belonging to the Estate
 of William Griffin deceased containing 24¹/₂ acres more or less and bounded by the
 lands of his son namely, of Joseph and Est and the Redman's old tract and the said
 party of the first part doth also sell, grant and convey unto the said party of
 the second part one brown horse to have to hold the interest in the above said
 two tracts of land, and the said brown horse to him and his heirs forever. In trust
 however to secure to James E. Johnson the payment of one note for the sum of
