This Agreement made this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May <sup>in the year</sup> 1881, between Cornelius Gray of the first part, and Barham & Pinner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witness as follows: Whereas the said Cornelius Gray is engaged in, and is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and it is his wish that the said Barham & Pinner should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Pinner have agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, That the said Barham & Pinner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Cornelius Gray during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars or seven hundred and seventy five cents) as may be needed to enable the said Cornelius Gray to cultivate and gather his crops prepared to be made the present year. And the said Cornelius Gray hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Pinner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Rye, Peas, Potatoes, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873, Witness our hands this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1881.

This Agreement made this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May in the year 1881, between J. E. Applewhite of the first part and Barham & Pinner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witness as follows: Whereas the said J. E. Applewhite is engaged in, and is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and it is his wish that the said Barham & Pinner should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Pinner have agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, That the said Barham & Pinner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said John E. Applewhite during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars or seven hundred and seventy five cents) as may be needed to enable the said John E. Applewhite to cultivate and gather his crops prepared to be made the present year. And the said John E. Applewhite hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Pinner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Rye, Peas, Potatoes, Cotton and all other crops also 1/4 crop made by Bird Gray and my part of the H. Applewhite cotton crop made on my farm. I also cut 1000 lbs of 13 guineas to be included in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May, 1881.
