This Agreement made this 27th day of March in the year 1881 between Miles Sykes of the first part, and Barham & Pinner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Whereas the said Miles Sykes is engaged in, or is about to engage in, the cultivation of the soil, and in pursuance thereof, that the said Barham & Pinner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Pinner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement witnesses that the said Barham & Pinner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Miles Sykes during the present year, such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars doctors in amount as may be needed to enable the said Miles Sykes to cultivate and gather his crops for profit to be made the present year.
