Whereas the said Miles Sykes is engaged in, as it is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement doth witnesseth That the said Barham & Turner doth hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Miles Sykes during the present year, such money, provisions, fertilizer and other supplies not exceeding the sum of fifty dollars doctors in amount as may be needful to enable the said Miles Sykes to cultivate and gather his crop for profit to be made the present year. And the said Miles Sykes hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year for the cost of corn fodder, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.
