Sumner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witness us before. Whereas the said Jas. S. Sumner is engaged in or is about about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous that the said Barham & Sumner should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Sumner has been agreed to do. Now this Agreement between that the said Barham & Sumner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Jas. S. Sumner during the present year, such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of thirty dollars in amount) as may be useful to enable the said Jas. S. Sumner to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Jas. S. Sumner hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Sumner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year to wit, Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Pumpkins, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.
