This Agreement made this 30th day of April in the year 1881 between Augustus Wiggins of the first part, and Barham & Turner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witness this as follows: Whereas the said Augustus Wiggins is engaged in, and is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivation of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner have agreed to do. Now this agreement witnesseth, that the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Augustus Wiggins during the present year such money provisions fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of ninety five dollars (dollar in amount) as may be useful to enable the said A. Wiggins to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to make the present year. And the said A. Wiggins hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton, and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies as may be actually made not exceeding the sum of \$95 or stated. This agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 30th day of May 1881.

Witness this as follows: Whereas the said Robt. Bricheton is engaged in, and is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner should during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivation of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner have agreed to do. Now this agreement witnesseth, that the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Robt. Bricheton during the present year such money provisions fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars in amount) as may be useful to enable the said Robt. Bricheton to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to make the present year. And the said Robt. Bricheton hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated. This agreement is made in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 25th day of March 1881.
