

This Deed of trust made and entered into this 16th day of May 181
 between James R. Hills grantor of the first part, Mr. B. Shands trustee
 of the second part and Benjamin E. Morell beneficiary of the third
 part witnesseth that the said James R. Hills doth give, grant, bargain
 and sell unto Mr. B. Shands a certain lot of land lying in the town of
 Jerusalem known as lot no 13 in the fifth of the said town containing
 by estimate one half acre it being the lot formerly owned by Richard
 H. Blythe and sold by Mrs. B. Shands his trustee and bounded as
 follows on the North and South by the lands of James H. Rochester and
 South and east by the public streets of the said town. In trust to receive a
 bond for six hundred and thirty four dollars and seventy three cents
 bearing date the same day with the said James R. Hills shall have three
 years to pay the above said bond as condition of his paying the entire
 amount to the said Benjamin E. Morell but on the failure of the said
 James R. Hills to pay the said interest at the end of any year or at the
 end of three years from this day which ever may first occur then the
 said Mr. B. Shands an agent of Benjamin E. Morell as his legal
 representation shall at twenty days notice at Jerusalem sell an even
 County Court day to the highest bidder for cash the said lot of land subject
 to a tax of two hundred and four dollars and twenty seven cents due
 bonds James R. Hills and after paying off all the costs of the execution of this
 trust including the usual commissions of four per cent to the trustee pay
 to Benjamin E. Morell his bond and interest and the balance if any
 pay due to James R. Hills as aforesaid the following signature and seal

This Deed made this 31st day of March in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
 & Eighteen, between George D. Whifield and Mary E. his wife of the first part
 and William Johnson of the second part to wit, that in consideration of the
 sum of \$3000, five hundred dollars, the said George D. Whifield and Mary E.
 Whifield his wife deignent sells the said William Johnson and his heirs
 forever with his wife Mary, all her interest in a certain grist mill known
 as Vick's Mill and saw mill, known as Johnson's Scorn mill, and
 situated near by said grist mill all the fixtures and appurtenances connected
 with both said mills, and all the land thereunto attached being in the county
 of Southampton and State of Virginia. The said George D. Whifield and
 Mary E. his wife do covenant that they have the right to convey the said land
 to the grantees that they have done no act to encumber the said land that
 the grantees shall have quiet possession of the said land free from all encum-
 brance, and that they said George D. Whifield and Mary E. Whifield parts
