

This Agreement made and entered into this the 16th day of May 1881 between J. E. Bailey, &c of the first part and J. A. Gutchellos of the second part, witnesseth as follows that whereas the said J. A. Gutchellos is engaged in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain supplies of fertilizer during the year 1881, from the said J. E. Bailey &c for the amount of Two hundred dollars beyond that amount they shall not go, and the said Bailey &c having agreed to furnish the said supplies, now the said J. A. Gutchellos on this part and in consideration of the above done and promised do hereby grant a lien to the said Bailey &c on all the crops that may be made during the year 1881 upon the lands that the said Gutchellos cultivates for the amount of the above aforesaid and the cost of this agreement, it is furthermore agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said Bailey &c by or before the first day of Dec 1881 and in case the said crops are not delivered at the time aforesaid to satisfy this agreement, then the said Bailey &c is hereby empowered to employ labor to take charge and gather said crops himself or enough of said crops to satisfy this agreement and moreover it is especially agreed by the parties to this agreement that no part of said crops shall be sold, or carried away unless it is by and through the consent of said Bailey &c until this agreement satisfied. This agreement is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 23rd 1773 entitled an act to secure evidence for agricultural purposes.

Edwards on his part and in consideration of the above aforesaid and promises do hereby grant a lien to the said Bailey &c on all the crops that may be made during the year 1881 upon the lands that the said Edwards cultivates for the amount of the above aforesaid and the cost of this agreement, it is furthermore agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said Bailey &c by or before the first day of Dec 1881 and in case the said crops are not delivered at that time as enough to satisfy this agreement then the said Bailey &c is hereby empow-
