This agreement made and entered into this 7th day of May, 1881, between Pope T. Woodard of the 1st part and Gible Riedley of the 2nd part, Witnesseth as follows, that whereas the said Gible Riedley is about to engage in cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1881 from the said Pope T. Woodard to the amount of one hundred dollars beyond which amount the said Gible Riedley shall not go and the said Pope T. Woodard having on their part agreed to furnish said supplies, Now the said Gible Riedley on his part and in consideration of the above provisions doth grant a lien to the said Pope T. Woodard on any and all crops which may be made during the year 1881 upon the land of which the said Gible Riedley cultivates for the above amount of advances which has been or is intended to have been expended. Now it is further agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said Pope T. Woodard shall first be paid and satisfied after which the balance of any shall be paid over to the said Gible Riedley. This lien is granted under an act of the general assembly of Va. approved April 2nd 1873 entitled an act to secure the collection for agricultural purposes. Woodard of the first, and Henry Backlin of the second Witnesseth as follows, that whereas the said Henry Backlin has engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1881 from the said Pope T. Woodard to the amount of one hundred dollars beyond which amount the said Henry Backlin shall not go and the said Pope T. Woodard having on their part agreed to furnish said supplies, Now the said Henry Backlin on his part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a lien to the said Pope T. Woodard on any and all crops which may be made during the year 1881 upon the land of which the said Henry Backlin cultivates for the above amount of advances which has been or is intended to have been expended. Now it is further agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said Pope T.
