This Deed made this 7th day of May, 1884, between Bettie McLean
McCasenbury, of Southampton County, Virginia, of the first part, Hester Biggs
of Norfolk City, Virginia, in his alone right and as surviving partner
of the late firm of Hester Biggs & Co., of the second part, and Neal Biggs
of said City and State of the third party, witnesseth, That the said
Bettie McLean McCasenbury, in consideration of the sum of Nine Hundred
Dollars to her in hand paid by the said Hester Biggs, cloth heavily
laundered, set, and delivered unto the said Hester Biggs all the right
title and interest of her the said Bettie McLean McCasenbury in and to
that certain tract of land in Southampton County, Virginia, of
which her late husband William A. McCasenbury died seized and
possessed, the interest of the said Bettie McLean McCasenbury therein
being, her dower as widow of her said late husband, duly assign-
ed to her by the Court of said County of Southampton
and being the same tract of land that has been occupied and
residence by the said Bettie McLean McCasenbury, down to the present
time, And whenever the said Bettie McLean McCasenbury, by deed
bearing date the 19th day of April 1879, and duly recorded in the
Deeds office of the County Court of Southampton County
aforesaid, did convey her interest in the said tract of land
