This Agreement made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1881 between Benjamin W. Merryman of the one part and Benjamin Woodcock of the other part both of Southampton County, Virginia, that whereas Benjamin Woodcock is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain advances in supplies from the said Benjamin W. Merryman to the amount of forty Dollars beyond which limit the said Benjamin Woodcock shall not exceed the said Benjamin W. Merryman having agreed to furnish said amount of advances now the said Benjamin W. Woodcock on his part and in consideration of the above premises, do hereby grant a lien to the said Benjamin W. Merryman on 2 Bales of a middleling Cotton the first of his crop, outside rent made during the year 1881, upon the lands in cultivation belonging to R. W. Joyce, & J. V. Rogers of which the said amount of advances was intended to be so loan. Expended this lien is granted unless an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1881 entitled an act to secure advances for agricultural purposes, witness the following signatures.
