Whereas on the 22nd day of June 1881 Emma Carr the wife of
 B. P. Carr joined with the said B. P. Carr in a deed of trust executed
 by them jointly to R. H. Revels Trustee by which said they conveyed
 all lot and its improvements at June 18th Isle of Wight County
 Va to the said trustee for the purpose of securing a certain debt there
 in which conveyance the said Emma Carr agrees and hereby
 with her doower interest in the said property upon an agreement
 that her said husband should and could execute to a trustee for
 his separate & sole benefit a deed conveying their Homestead and
 all personal chattel property to said trustee for the uses of himself
 and coheires on the 22nd day of June 1881 Emma Carr the wife of
 B. P. Carr joined with the said B. P. Carr in a deed of trust executed
 by them jointly to C. B. Lewis & Peter by which said they
 convey a certain farm in Southampton County to the said
 trustee to secure certain debts therein mentioned all of which
 debts above debt due by B. P. Carr and for which the doower interest
 of the said Emma Carr was not in any manner liable and by
 which said last mentioned deed the said Emma Carr agrees
 and partakes with her doower interest in the said property upon an
 agreement that her said husband should and could execute
 a trustee for separate and sole use and benefit a deed conveying
 their Homestead Place on which they now reside and all personal
 chattel property to said trustee for his separate and sole use
 Now therefore this 22nd day of June 1881 between the said
 B. P. Carr of the first part and J. W. Dick Chancery trustee for his
 known integrity and honesty of the second part witnesseth
 that in consideration of the premises the said B. P. Carr doth hereby
 sell grant and convey unto the J. W. Dick the following property
 to wit all that tract of land situated in the County of Southam-
 pton and State of Virginia containing vicinity situated more
 or less and bounded and described as follows on North & East by
 the Blackwater River South by the lands formerly belonging to
 James P. Boeseler but now belonging to Bell & Brothers West by
 the lands of John Grumpler, it being the same land on which
 the said B. P. Carr and his wife now resides and which was
 conveyed to B. P. Carr by R. W. Clayton by deed duly recorded
 said land being the Homestead Place or tract for the sole
 uses, apparatus and benefit of Emma Carr until her late
 forever for and clear of and from any marital rights or
 obligations whatsoever of her present husband or of any future
 husband but subject of course to the debt incurred by the said of trust
 by B. P. Carr on the 22nd June 1881 which she has signed
 And the said trustee upon a written request of the said Emma
 Carr property will record by two witnesses may sell and convey
 the said property to any party who shall be named by said
 Emma Carr in such written request also of his Household
 and Kitchen Furniture Stock & Animals, Running implements
 and chattel property of all descriptions held on trust in
