Known all men by these presents that J. Anderson Esquire of the County of South Hampton do sell & convey unto to W. B. Nicholson my Guy mule now in my possession & my entire crop of every kind of cotton corn fodder & provisions made in the year 1881 at a fair cash valuation to him & hold to him this hire forever for the following considerations First to secure a payment of note dated 11th Nov 1881 for \$200 & 400 dollars with interest the balance due on crop of last year & an mule above named Second to secure the amount of One Hundred & fifteen dollars for a claim on fatigues & supplies for this year It is agreed that if I am my representative pay unto to W. B. Nicholson or his heirs the sum above named as above before the 1st of December & until such payment shall not cause to destroy sell or remove the same & in case of death of the mule holder myself or his heirs for the full value thereof receiving all & none but all exemptions with the present & every thing herein contained shall cease to be void otherwise remain in force & effect and default in the foregoing conditions W. B. Nicholson or his representative may take the property at a fair cash valuation, or sell at auction of five ten days notice to me & advertising at his store retaining the sum of money secured with in all cost of sale including the expenses to me & my heirs It is agreed also that until default of these conditions J. Anderson Esquire may retain possession of the property provided I deliver my sole crop as fast as ready for sale to W. B. Nicholson & witness my hand & seal this 31st day of May in the year 1881

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Known all men by these presents that J. Thos. Walker of the County of Southampton do sell & convey unto to W. B. Nicholson my entire crop of every kind of cotton corn fodder & provisions made in the year 1881 at a fair cash valuation to him & hold to him this hire forever for the following considerations First to secure a payment of Fifty or more dollars with interest due on bonds for the year 1880 & the same amount due on bonds for the year 1881 Second to secure the amount of Forty dollars a claim on fatigues & supplies for this & last year Third to secure the sum of Sixty five dollars & interest to be paid for a black horse bought for me by W. B. Nicholson to whom he belongs until paid for & for which I am obligated to pay at time this bill is due whether the horse is sound injured or dead It is agreed that if I am my representative pay unto to W. B. Nicholson or his heirs the sum above named as above before the 1st day of December 1881 and until such payment shall not cause to destroy sell or remove the same & in case of death of the horse holder myself I am responsible for the full value thereof receiving all & none but all
