 their ^{own} default, now therefore this deed made this 13th day of July
 1881 between the said W. E. Beale of one part and J. B. Prince, trustee of
 the second part, witnesseth, that in consideration of the aforesaid
 premises and the sum of five dollars the said W. E. Beale does hereby
 grant and convey with general warranty to the said trustee his
 interest in his present growing Crops of Corn, fodder, Cotton and
 peanuts and also his interest in the Crops of his tenants, in trust
 to indemnify & save harmless his securities as aforesaid, and it is
 agreed that the said Beale may gather & dispose of the said Crops provided
 that after paying the expenses of making and securing the same, the
 balance of the proceeds, as so much thereof as the said securities may
 desire shall be applied to the payment of the aforesaid bonds,
