Virginia in consideration of the sum of Thirty nine Dollars and ^{and interest} ~~one~~ ^{one} cent
evidenced to me by Dr. W. Nickols in supplies, merchandise, &c as shown
by due bills and accounts for the sum aforesaid do convey unto him the
following property to wit my Crop of Cotton and 10 acres land my
Crop of Beans and 20 acres of Cell. sky Corn & fodder all made in the
year 1881 to have and hold to him the grantee and his heirs assigns
forever I covenant this property free of all incumbrance and fully defend
the right it is agreed however that if the grantee or any of his relatives
pay unto Dr. W. Nickols or his representative the sum aforesaid
and before the 1st day of November 1882 in satisfaction for his property
(and until such payment shall not excede) day, in full all or any part
thereof this sum and in case of injury or death from any cause
