This Deed made this the 19th day of April 1881 between James E. Sebell and Ann M. Sebell his wife, of the first part and A. D. Pettors, Geo. C. Vick and Edwin White School Trustees of the Jerusalem District of the second part, witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and fifty two dollars and twenty five cents in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the party of the first part doth grant and convey with special warranty unto the said Trustees, parties of the second part a certain tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County, being the same as which the Deed to Prith Lodge No. 2222 stands containing one half acre and bounded as follows, beginning at a stake near the north East corner of the house and running easterly line a South easterly course along a well chopped line to the Public Road, or coastly, course thirty nine and a half yards, thence along a well chopped line a north easterly
