This Deed made this the 19th day of April 1881 between James E. Schell and Ann M. Schell his wife of the first part and A. G. Prentiss, George Vick and Marvin White School Trustee of the Jurisdiction District of the second part witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty two dollars and twenty five cents in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged the party of the first part doth grant and convey with special warranty unto the said Trustees, part of the second part a certain tract of land lying in Southampton County, being the same as which the Town of Brighth Lodge Road now stands containing one half acre and bounded as follows, by running due stake north the north East corner of the house and running a direct line a South easterly course along a due cheppit line to the Public Road, a westerly course thirty nine and a half yards, thence along a new chop of line a north easterly
