of the county of Southampton in Virginia of the other part witnesseth that the said
Harris of Waltham Harris for & in consideration of the sum of sixty pounds our money
of Virg. to them in hand paid at or before the sealing & delivery of this present the receipt
whereof the said James Harris of Waltham Harris doth hereby acknowledge & that of acquit
discharge the said Coryour Morris his heirs & assigns for ever hath granted bar-
gained sold & conveyed released & confirmed & do by this present grant bargain sell & con-
veyed & confirmed unto the said Coryour Morris his heirs & assigns for ever one certain
tract or parcel of land lying & being situate in the parish of St Luke in the county
of Southampton on the S. side of Blackwater Swamp it being part of a patent
granted to Genl. Harris by the Honble Alexander Spotswood esq. commander in
chief of this colony the thirtieth day of Nov. one thousand seven hundred & eighty
seven in the twelfth year of the reign of our sovereign Lady Ann for five hundred acres
being that part of the said survey which was conveyed from the said Genl. Harris to Robt.
Harris by indenture of bargain & sale bearing the twentieth day of April one thousand
seven hundred & eighty seven & descending from the said Robt. Harris to the above named James Harris
Waltham Harris his son the said land being bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning
at a pine the head line of the patent survey & turning a Northward course by a line
of marked trees down to Hargreaves branch to a white oak on the other side of the sur-
vey & turning the course of the said stream to include all the lower end of the said sur-
vey to the beginning place where it is marked & to the said seventy acres & the
same more or less And also the remainder of the said land
