This Indenture made the twenty first day of Dec. in the year four hundred
seven hundred & thirty six between Arthur Arington of Edgecomb county of Carolina of the one
part & Peter Bolton of Southampton county of the other part witnesseth that the
Arthur Arington for & in consideration of the sum of seventy pounds to him in hand
paid as or before the executing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth
hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed & confirmed by these
presents doth grant bargain sell alien & confirm unto the Peter Bolton & his heirs
for ever one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying & being in the county of So-
thampton containing two hundred & eighty two acres be it more or less bounded as
followeth beginning at a Willow oak standing in Laspencers swamp thence up to
small branch N. fifty five degrees E. sixty poles to a black oak thence E. one hundred
fifty eight poles to an oak thence N. fifty one degrees E. fourteen poles to a pine thence
Seventy three degrees E. thirty four poles to a pine thence N. seventy four poles to
pine thence N. forty degrees W. thirty six poles to an oak thence N. ninety
degrees W. ninety six poles to a pine thence N. sixty eight degrees W. twenty eight poles
to a pine thence S. five degrees W. ninety four poles to a pine thence N. fifty seven
