This Indenture made this ninth day of March 1760 in the eighth year of the reign
 of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of God of Great Britain Francis
 King defender of the faith &c. between Joseph Scott of the county of Hanover merchant
 of the one part & Howell Edmunds of the county of Southampton planter of the other
 part witnesseth that the said Joseph Scott for his consideration of the sum of seventy
 five pounds ten shillings over money of Virg. to him in hand paid by the
 said Edmunds the receipt whereof he doth
 hereby acknowledge & himself therewith fully contented satisfied & paid hath given
 granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released & confirmed & by these presents doth give
 himself his heirs & assigns fully freely & absolutely give grant bargain sell alien
 enfeoff release convey & confirm unto the said Howell Edmunds his heirs & assigns
 & assigns for ever two certain parcels or tracts of land situate lying & being in the
 county of Southampton on the south side of Netoway river which the said Joseph
 purchased of Joseph Marshall. The first tract or parcel containing one hundred & twenty
 acres the common or less & bounded as followeth to wit beginning at a live oak
 on the south west side of Blunt swamp a line run off the Netoway Indian land
 thence by the said Indians line Northward two hundred & thirty four poles to a white oak
 then southward by south one hundred & thirty four poles to a pine then south fifty degrees
 East two hundred & thirty two poles to a pine & North fifty degrees East one hundred & thirty
 The second tract or parcel containing two hundred & thirty four acres be the same more or less
 as followeth to wit beginning at a red oak on Barrons road in the Indian outline then
 along the said line south fifty five degrees East three hundred & thirty four poles to a live oak
 in Blunt swamp thence up the meadow of the said swamp to the mouth of the
 branch thence up the meadow of the said Deep Branch to a red oak standing
 on Barrons road thence up the said road to the beginning with the said
