This indenture made the twelfth day of May in the eighth year of the reign of
our sovereign lord King George the third in the year of our lord Christ on thousand seven hundred and
sixty eight between Richard Thirby of the county of Southampton first of the one part and
Foster the younger of the same county second of the other part now this indenture witnesseth
that the said Richard Thirby for & in consideration of the sum of fifty three pounds current money
in hand paid by the said Foster the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & discharge the said
Foster his two sons & assigns forever by their present & future grant & assign
all such right & claim which by their present & future grant & assign he had & enjoyed
the said Foster his two sons & assigns for ever one certain tract or parcel of land
situate in the county of Southampton or less situated lying & being on the north side of the road
in the parish of St. Andrew as followeth beginning at a white oak tree near the
peg in the thirty one pole to a pine tree north seventy six degrees west seventy two pole
to a pine tree south seventy seven degrees west fifty four pole to a pine tree north
peg in the thirty two pole to a poplar on the reedy branch thence up the main road
the reedy branch to a poplar thence north seventy degrees east fifty eight pole to a white
oak tree thence south thirty seven degrees east on a line of sixty seven pole to a light house
thence south twenty seven degrees west seventy pole to the beginning likewise on a line
across whereon the said Foster now lives it being the land given by Rich^d Thirby to the
Moody & now has returned to Rich^d Thirby yet he being his at law adjoining the one
seventy seven acres above mentioned in all two hundred & seventy seven acres with all woods
underwood house & out houses water & water courses profits & commodities hereditaments
appurtenances whatsoever to the said two hundred & seventy seven acres of land belonging or apper-
taining & the revers & confusions & remainder & the main & the whole & the profits
thereof & all the right & use & possession benefit & profit & claim & demand of him the said
Thirby of in & to the same And all & sundry evidences & writings touching or concerning
the same To have & to hold the said two hundred & seventy seven acres of land & premises with
the appurtenances unto the said Foster his heirs & assigns to the only & sole use & behoof
of the said Foster his heirs & assigns forever And the said Richard Thirby
hath the said two hundred & seventy seven acres of land & premises with the appurtenances
