This Indenture made the eleventh day of July one thousand seven hundred & eighty eight between Alexander Murray of the county of Southampton of the one part & John Clarke of the said county of the other part witnesseth that the said Alexander Murray for diverse causes concerning him therein moving but more especially for and in consideration of the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid or before the unveiling of delivery of the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath by then presents doth give bargain and sell unto the said John Clarke his heirs and assigns one tract or parcel of land containing by estimation fifty acres be the same more or less which said land is part of a patent granted to Edw. Harris for two hundred and fifty acres bearing date March the twenty fourth one thousand seven hundred & twenty five of bounds as follows: Beginning at a pine in Warroak branch on the north side thereof a corner tree of the said Clarke and Joseph Griffen line thence Southward to a small white oak in the Griffen line along the said line to a red oak a corner tree of John Harris & Joseph Griffen then southwardly to a small white oak thence to a small weed gum in a slash joining the Hopstick place a corner tree of John Harris thence to a pine thence along a straight line to an old white oak on the south side of a branch called the Bogg branch a corner tree then down the run of the said branch to Warroak branch thence up the various courses of the run of the said branch to the first station id being the residue of a tract or parcel of land granted to Edw. Harris for two hundred & fifty which bearing date as above March 24. 1725 To have & to hold the said fifty acres of land with the appurtenances & privileges thereto belonging unto the said John Clarke his heirs and assigns to the only proper use & behoof of the said John Clarke
