 hundred and eighty eight between W^m Kennelwell of the county of Southampton parish of St. Luke
 and Jacob Kennelwell of the said county parish of the other part in presence of
 W^m Kennelwell for and in consideration of the sum of ten pounds of good lawful money of
 Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Jacob Kennelwell the receipt whereof the said W^m
 Kennelwell hereby acknowledge that he granted bargained sold unto the said Jacob Kennelwell
 parcel or tract of land for grand bargain well alien confirmed unto the said Jacob Kennelwell
 the said tract or parcel of land of the said Jacob Kennelwell his heirs forever the said W^m
 Kennelwell alien confirmed the said tract or parcel of land lying & being in the county of
 Southampton on the south side of Netterway river on both sides of Cocken swamp
 followeth to wit beginning at a firm corner of Rob^t. Butler's land by a narrow
 north side of the south prong of Cocken swamp a few furlongs down the river
