This Indenture made the eighth day of January the eighth year of the reign of our  
 sovereign lord George the third King of Great Britain France & Ireland by the year of our lord  
 Christ one thousand seven hundred & eighty eight Between John Dorch & his wife Ruth of the  
 county of Southampton of the one part & Cordall Norfolk of the county aforesaid of the other  
 part witnesseth that the said John Dorch & Ruth his wife for & in consideration of the  
 sum of forty pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Cordall Nor-  
 folk at & upon the concluding & delivery of this present the receipt whereof the said John Dorch  
 & his wife Ruth doth hereby acknowledge & they doth acquit the said Cordall Norfolk  
 his heirs & assigns that he granted bargain'd & sold alien enfeof & confirmed & confirmed by this  
 present doth grant bargain'd & sell alien enfeof confirm & make over unto the said Cordall  
 Norfolk his heirs and assigns for ever one certain tract parcel or dividend of land containing  
 one hundred & four acres more or less lying & being in the aforesaid county of Virginia of the  
 hundred & eighty acres granted to James Ramsey by patent bearing date at Williamsburg  
 the twenty second day of August one thousand seven hundred & eighty three & bounded as follow-  
 eth to wit beginning at a white oak on north side of the Flad swamp then running  
 round by the line of the said patent to the Runy branch then down the various course  
 of the run of the said branch to a small branch in the west side thereof then up the small  
 branch to a gum sapling standing in the head thereof & as per deed from said James Ramsey  
 & wife to the said John Dorch & bearing date the 13 of Sept. 1753 & the river or  
 navigation or main river & main river of singular the premises with the appurtenances  
 & all the estate right title possession claim & demand whatsoever of them the said John  
 Dorch & Ruth his wife to the said land & premises or of in or unto any part thereof  
 to have & to hold the said land & premises with the appurtenances unto the said  
 Cordall Norfolk his heirs and assigns for ever & to no other use intent or meaning whatso-  
 ever & the said John Dorch & Ruth his wife doth hereby promise for themselves & their heirs  
 that they & every of them shall & will war and & forever defend by their persons the  
 above mentioned premises with their & every of their appurtenances unto the said Cordall  
 Norfolk his heirs & assigns for ever In witness whereof we have hereunto set our  
 hands & seals the day & year above written
