 a piece forever without any manner of claim challenge or demand what so ever
 from any person or persons what so ever against all people do what so ever
 for ever defend by then present the said land which the said Harry Johnson
 have put the said Council Johnson in full peaceable possession firmly

 twenty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid as or before the
 & delivering hereof the receipt whereof the said Jn. Pope Gov. doth hereby
 ledge hath granted bargain sold & by this present doth fully & absolutely
 grant bargain sell alien & confirm unto him the said Titus Carr his heirs
 assign one certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the aforesaid county
 of Southampton on the south side of Potomack river containing by ap-
 portion fifty acres & bounded as followeth. To wit. Beginning on the
 line at Robt. Gilliams corner then running on the S. Williams line
 over the line then on the S. Over the line to a great branch then down the
 various courses of the run of the Great branch to a small branch to the
