This Indenture made this twelfth day of Jan. in the ninth year  
 of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of God Great Britain  
 France and Ireland King defender of the faith &c. In the year of our Lord  
 Christ one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine Between  
 John Mason the elder of the county of Sussex & Elizabeth his wife of the one  
 part & Robert Scarborough of the county of Southampton of the other  
 part witnesseth that the said John Mason for and in consideration  
 of the sum of ninety six pounds current money of Virginia to him in  
 hand paid before the sealing & delivery of these presents by the said Robt.  
 Scarborough to the receipt whereof the said John Mason doth hereby acknowledge he the said John Mason and Elizabeth his wife have granted bargain  
 & sold aliened & confirmed & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell  
 confirm & confirm unto the said Robt. Scarborough his heirs &  
 assigns for ever all that certain tract or parcel of land situate lying  
 & being in the county of Southampton & on the north side of Hottorway  
 River containing by estimation two hundred & seventy five acres be the  
 same more or less & bounded by the most known around & reputed  
 bound it being the land formerly belonging to Isaac Mason (now dead)  
 & which after the decease of the said Isaac Mason became vested in  
 the said John Mason as heir at law to the said Isaac part of the  
 said land was granted to the said Isaac Mason to wit. one hundred & twenty  
 five acres by patent bearing date the twentieth day of August one  
 thousand seven hundred & forty. Reference thereto being had  
 may more fully appear And one hundred acres of the same
