Turners hath and doth grant Bargain and sell Alien Enjoy and Confirm
unto the said John Rogers his heirs and assigns forever all that certain
tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of South
ampton and Parish of Saint Lukes as aforesaid and on the north side
of Maherrin River containing by estimation Two hundred and fifty
acres be the same more or less and is bounded as Follows (To wit) Begin
ing at a Hickory upon the Bank of Maherrin River a Corner of James West
which oak the Survey 1761 after line then along the said oak line to a corner
thence along the said Survey line to a corner Hickory in the
Turners line thence along the said Turners line to Maherrin River and up
