In obedience to the Last will and Testaments of John Little Deceased we the subscribers being desired by the said John Little in his life time and last will to lay off and divide the lands bequeathed by John Little Deceased have set apart to his widow Lucy Little as for her dower in all the lands bequeathed by the said John Little Deceased that is to say Beginning at a street gate on the side of a branch thence along a line of marked Trees to a red oak in William Blunt's line we also have run the dividing line between the Deceased's two sons William and John Little that is to say Beginning at a Pine in the said will will mentioned a line Tree in William Poyne's line thence a long a line of marked Trees to a branch that divides the two plantations thence along the said branch to the gumlog gut thence down the said gut to an oak thence a long a line of marked Trees to a red oak at the head of the gullons gut upon the river bank Certified under our hands this first day of May 1769
