This Indenture made this 12<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty nine Between Thomas Williamson of the County of Southampton of the one part & William Urquhart of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said Thomas Williamson for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid or before the sealing or delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Thomas Williamson his heirs & assigns forever hath granted bargained & sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell one certain Tract or parcel of Land in the parish of Botolph Claydon and County of Norfolk and on the south side of Mariah Branch containing by estimation one hundred Acres by the same more or less & bounded as followeth viz Beginning at a Copse on Mariah Branch adjoining the land the said William Urquhart lately purchased of John Longshaw thence along the said line to Congers Mariah Line and along the said Congers Mariah Line to Mariah Branch & down the various courses of the said Branch to marked Maple thence along by a line of marked Trees to the Copse begun at together with all the appurtenances belonging thereto to have & to hold the said Tract of Land with the appurtenances unto the said William Urquhart his heirs & assigns forever and the said Thomas Williamson for himself & his heirs doth covenant and agree to and with the said William Urquhart his heirs and assigns that he and they shall and may at all times hereafter quietly and peaceably enjoy and possess the above mentioned Land and premises free from all Incumbrances
