This Indenture made this 10 day of October in the ninth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King defender of the faith &c. and in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred sixty nine Between Plythe Williams of the parish of Holloway in the County of Southampton of the one part and Joseph Doles of the same parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Plythe Williams for and in the consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Doles the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and hereof acquit and discharge the said Plythe Williams hath granted bargained &c. sold aliened conveyed confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell aliened conveyed and confirm unto the said Joseph Doles and to his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation ninety acres be the same more or less and bounded as followeth. Beginning at a corner tree a white Oak thence along Stephenson's line to a corner tree and Oak thence along Mannings line to the Village branch thence down the said branch to a pine aline tree thence along the said Mannings line to the first station the same being part of a tract or parcel of Land which Joseph Doles purchased being thence
