This Indenture made this twenty first day of October in the year of our
Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine Between Drury Long
of Halifax county of Nor. h. Carolina of the one part and Samuel Westbrook
Jun. of Southampton county of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth
that the said Drury Long for and in consideration of the sum of seventy pounds
current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Samuel
Westbrook Jun. before the sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof the said Drury Long doth hereby acknowledge & himself thence
well fully contented and satisfied hath granted bargained sold aliened
and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien
and confirm unto the said Samuel Westbrook Jun. his heirs & or
assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land situate
lying and being in the county of Southampton aforesaid on the south
side Nottoway River and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning on
Joshua Barnes mill pond near a Beaver pond thence along a line of
marked trees that divides this said tract of land from the land William
Westbrook owned & lived on in his life time to a corner tree a Hickory thence
along a line of marked trees that divides the s. two tracts of land between
white oak in the new house branch thence up the various courses
of the said new house branch to a corner Poplar thence near a south
west course a small distance to a corner Hickory thence along a
line of marked trees that divides this s. land from the said Samuel
