 Lord one thousand seven hundred & seventy Between Kirby Porter of the county  
 of Southampton of the one part & Charles Shields of the county of Isle of Wight  
 of the other part witnesseth that the said Kirby Porter for & in consideration of  
 the sum of thirty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid  
 by the said Charles Shields at & upon the sealing & delivery of these presents the  
 receipt whereof the said Kirby Porter doth hereby acknowledge & himself to be  
 therewith fully satisfied contented & paid of thereof doth clearly acquit and  
 discharge the said Charles Shields his heirs & assigns for ever by these  
 presents Both given granted bargained sold conveyed & performed by the
