said Robert Mercer for & in consideration of the sum of eighty pounds current money
of Virginia to him in hand paid at or before the enrolling & delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge & thereof acquit and discharge the said Edmund
Jenkins his heirs & assigns for ever He hath granted bargained & sold aliened enfeoffed and
confirmed & doth by these presents grant bargain sell alien enfeoff & confirm unto the
said Edmund Jenkins his heirs & assigns one certain tract or parcel of land contain-
ing by estimation two hundred & fifty acres be the same more or less one hundred & fifty
acres of which being a tract or parcel of land granted by letters patent bearing date
the eighteenth day of March one thousand seven hundred & seven to Jacob Sum-
merville of Isle of Wight county & bounded according to that patent reference being
had to the Secretarys Office may more fully appear which said one hundred & fifty
acres was afterwards sold by the above Jacob Summerville to William Colson of
Isle of Wight county by indenture of bargain & sale recorded in Isle of Wight county
afterwards sold by the said W^m Colson to the above Robert Mercer who now stands
lawfully seized thereof in fee simple The other one hundred acres part of the tract
above mentioned is a tract whereof John Williampon stood seized in fee tail to him
of the heirs of his body lawfully begotten by virtue of the last will & testament of
Geo. Williampon formerly of Isle of Wight county & the said John Williampon being
 minded to sell the said land & bar the entail thereof sued out of the Secretarys
Office a writ in the nature of an ad quod damnum to the sheriff of the said
county directed bearing test at Williamsburg the 28th day of August one
thousand seven hundred & thirty six to which writ the sheriff made return
that by the oaths of James Atkinson & eleven other good & lawful men of
