

This Indenture made this 11th day of April in the year of
 our Lord 1778 between Rich^d Blou of Mowry Blou his
 wife of the county of Southampton planter of the one part and
 Michael Byrnum of the county of Dorset of the other part
 Witnesseth that the said Richard Blou & M^{rs} Blou wife for
 in consideration of the sum of £100 of good & lawfull
 money of this Colony to them in hand paid before the
 enacting & delivery hereof by the said Michael the Receipt whereof
 they hereby acknowledge themselves therewith fully contented
 satisfied & paid hath given granted bargained sold aliened En
 feoffed released conveyed & confirmed by these presents doth for
 themselves their heirs Exors & assigns fully & absolutely give
 grant bargain sell alien Enfeoff release Convey & fully confirm
 unto the said Michael Byrnum his heirs Exors & assigns
 forever two certain parcels or tracts of land Situate lying and
 being in the county of Southampton & on the south side of
 Mottoway river beginning at a gum on the south side of
 Tamaroc Creek thence South 50 degrees west 205 poles to a pine
 then north 60 degrees west 105 poles to a white oak then north
 20 degrees west 15 1/2 poles to a Gum by the side of the Cypress
 branch then down the various courses of the run of the said branch
 to Tamaroc Creek as aforesaid & down the various courses of the run of
 the said Creek to the beginning & being a patent formerly granted
 to Thomas Pitman bearing date the 15th day of March 1741 for 375
 acres more or less the second tract or parcel beginning at a white
 oak by the side of the cypress branch from ^{thence} North 5 degrees west 52
 poles to a small white oak then north 40 degrees East 62 poles
 to a white oak thence north 70 degrees East 72 poles to a lightwood
 Stake in the said Pitman's old land then by the said Pitman's
 old line south 60 degrees East 94 poles to a pine south 52 degrees
