Southampton County in Virginia of the one part & Absalom Jeyner of Northampton County in the
Province of North Carolina of the other part Witnesseth that the said Handy Beal for the
consideration of the sum of two hundred Pound Current money of Virginia paid unto him
in hand by the said Absalom Jeyner the Receipt whereof I acknowledge myself fully Satisfied
have bargained sold & delivered unto Absalom Jeyner his heirs Executors or assigns the
whole tract or parcel of Land containing 330^{acres} lying in Southampton County in the North
side of Roanoke River and bounded as followeth begin at a marked Hickory on the River
Bank thence by a divided line betwixt the said Land and Henry Crofords Land to a marked
Pine in such above marsh thence along another line to a marked Cypress in the
said Land thence along his line to a marked Hickory in the Round Island thence
along another line to a marked Dogwood on the River bank up the course of the
River to the first Station To have and to hold the said Land with all houses
orchards gardens ways & waters with all other privileges properties commodities & advantages
to the said Lands belonging to him the said Absalom Jeyner his heirs Executors or assigns
