 part & John Bailey of the said County of Southampton the other
 part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Carroll & Priscilla Carroll for
 in consideration of the sum of fifty Pounds current money of Virginia
 to them in hand paid by the said John Bailey the receipt whereof the
 Thomas Carroll & Priscilla Carroll doth hereby acknowledge and they
 acquit and discharge the said John Bailey they bargain & sell alien
 enfeoffed & confirmed & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell alien
 & confirm unto the said John Bailey & to his heirs & assigns forever one certain
 tract or parcel of land situate lying & being on the south side of the main
 Black water swamp in the County of Southampton containing by
 estimation three hundred acres be the same more or less & bounded as follows
 Beginning at a white oak by the side of the Foxpen Branch
