Robert Thornley of the Borough of Chesterfield in the County of Derby gentleman
maketh oath and saith that he was present and did see William Plundell and Mary
and did see her unto annexed sign seal and delivery in due form of Law this said annexed
and Mary his wife John Hall and Catharine his wife and Mary Stors Spinster the persons named in the instrument
to Joshua Stors of Norfolk in the colony of Virginia Merchant and that the names
William Plundell Mary Plundell John Hall Catharine Hall Mary Stors
as the same appear to be subscribed to the said letter of Attorney as the parties causing the same
and of the several proper hands writing of them the said William Plundell and Mary his
wife John Hall Catharine his wife and Mary Stors respectively and this deponent further
saith that he this deponent and Thomas Sales of Chesterfield aforesaid were present
as witness to the execution of the said letter of Attorney and that the names of the said Thomas
Sales and this deponent as the same appear to be subscribed as witnesses to the due execution
thereof are of the respective proper hands writing of the said Thomas Sales and this deponent

William Stors of the Borough of Chesterfield in the County of Derby gentleman
being one of the people called Quakers, solemnly affirms that he knows William Plundell
and Mary his wife who was formerly the wife of Joseph Stors now deceased and John Hall
and Catharine his wife formerly Catharine Stors Spinster and Mary Stors Spinster the
persons named in and authors of the Letter of Attorney hereto annexed and that he this
affirmant did also know the said Joseph Stors in his life time and during his Marriage
with the said Mary now Mary Plundell and that they the said Joseph Stors and Mary
his wife had issue two daughters and two sons and no other children or namely the
Catharine now Catharine Hall) and the said Mary Stors Spinster of John Stors
deceased and Thomas Stors now also fixed thus: inserted in the said letter of Attorney
named and this affirmant saith he hath at this present time looked upon and examined
a memorial written upon a leaf belonging to the holy Bible which he this affirmant believes to be
the proper hand writing of the said Joseph Stors deceased and which memorial appears
in letters words and figures following "Joseph Stors and Mary Stors took each
other in marriage in their public meeting house at Dronfield 4th 3rd moth 1728 and
Catharine was born the 23rd 2nd moth 1729 - daughter Mary born 3rd 1st moth 1790 -
Son John born 7th 1st moth 1731 - Son Thomas born 23rd 6th moth 1733" and this affirmant
further saith that the said Joseph and Mary Stors were of the Faith and profession of these
people called Quakers and no register of marriages Births and Deaths was then regularly
kept at their meetings of divine worship but that he this affirmant does verily believe that
the said memorial contains of it self a true register of all the children of him the said Joseph
Stors deceased. And this affirmant further saith that the said John the son of
the said Joseph and Mary Stors did pass this life unmarried and without issue about the
year four Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty four and that Thomas being lately
deceased in Virginia aforesaid the said Catharine Hall and Mary Stors Spinster were
the only children being of them the said Joseph and Mary Stors and that the said Mary
now the wife of the said William Plundell was the widow of him the said Joseph Stors
and the mother of the said interlate Thomas Stors as aforesaid and together with the said
Catharine Hall and Mary Stors Spinster are the legal representatives of the said Thomas
Stors in regard to his personal estate and that they the said Catharine and Mary
were the Sides and are now the heirs of the said interlate in regard to his real estate
