This Indenture made this first day of February in the year of our Lord
 1772 Between Thomas Mills of the County of Southampton of the one part
 and Edwin Gray of the said County of the other part Where the said Thomas Mills
 is in possession of one negro man slave named Andrew and being indebted unto the
 said Edwin Gray the sum of forty eight pounds two Shillings & three pence for value
 received and the said Thomas Mills desirous to raise money to pay & satisfy the
 same This Indenture therefore Witnesseth that the said Thomas
 Mills as well for and in consideration of the premium as also for and in consideration
 of the sum of five Shilling to him in hand paid by the said Edwin Gray Health
 and both by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said Edwin Gray Health
 his heirs & assigns the above mentioned Slave Andrew unto the said Edwin Gray
 that is to say that he the said Edwin Gray his heirs executors administrators & assigns
 shall by fair sale of the above mentioned slave raise money sufficient to pay & satisfy
 to the said Edwin Gray the above mentioned debt of £48. 2. 3 with lawful interest
 to be computed from the day of the Date hereof To have and to hold
 the said slave Andrew Intireth for the purposes aforesaid unto the said Edwin
 Gray his heirs and assigns to the only use & behoof of the said Edwin Gray his heirs
 and assigns forever And the said Edwin Gray for himself heirs Executors &c.
 doth promise agree to and with the said Thomas Mills his heirs Executors &c. that
 he the said Edwin Gray his heirs Executors &c. shall & will make Sale of the said slave
 Andrew to the highest bidder that after performing the trust aforesaid by the said
 payment & reimbursing all cost expenses & charges attending the same will well and
 truly account with & pay unto the said Thomas Mills his heirs Executors or assigns
 all such sum & sum of money remaining in his hands & the said Thomas Mills on
 his part doth further covenant promise and agree that he will & required
 join in any Bill of Sale with the said Edwin Gray for the better & more absolute
 conveyance to any purchaser of the said slave And further that if it should
 so happen that upon a sale or disposal of the said slave by the said Edwin Gray
 that money sufficient should not be raised thereby to discharge the aforesaid debt
 expenses & charges that in such case he the said Thomas Mills his heirs Executors &c.
 shall and will well & truly pay of any balance that shall remain together with all
 interest expenses & charges attending the same & further that he the said Thomas
 Mills shall & will deliver up unto the said Edwin Gray immediately upon the execution
 of these premises full possession of the said slave Andrew In Witness whereof the
 said parties aforesaid have hereunto interchanged by set their hands & seals the day & year
 above written
